October 13 – Phillip James Dodd, The Gilded Age



Phillip James Dodd is a best-selling author, award-winning architect, and international speaker described by Julian Fellowes as probably the leading expert on the architecture of The Gilded Age. In this presentation, he will take us on an entertaining tour though some of the most magnificent buildings ever constructed in this country. He will also share some fascinating stories about the famous men and women who

designed and commissioned them – among them Astor, Carnegie, Frick, Morgan, and Vanderbilt, names that still reek of money.

Born and raised in the United Kingdom, Phillip moved to America more than 20 years ago. He has an undergraduate degree from the Manchester School of Architecture and an MA in architecture from the University of Notre Dame. Phillip is the recipient of several major architectural awards and author of a number of best-selling books. He is currently working on a new book with photographer Jonathan Wallen, due to be released next spring, on *The Mansions of The Gilded Age*.
