# **November 10 – Robert Altbaum, MD: Aging Responsibly**



Dr. Bob Altbaum, always a Y's Women favorite, will bring us another thoughtful talk about the issues of aging. In this presentation he will discuss the various ways we can be proactive for the benefit of our own health.

Bob was raised in the Bronx and received his early educa-

tion in the New York City school system. After receiving an MD degree from Harvard Medical School and completing his training at Massachusetts General and Yale New Haven hospitals, he practiced internal medicine in Westport for 40 years. Now in retirement from active practice, he teaches medical residents at Norwalk Hospital and serves as moderator of the Westport Library's Medical Lecture Series. He is also one of the founding members of Westport's popular, almost-all-doctor rock group, DNR.

## November 24 – State Representative Jonathan Steinberg: Transportation

Steinberg Jonathan been serving the citizens of Westport as State Representative in the Connecticut General Assembly since 2011. He has served on the Energy & Technology Committee for fifteen years, the past three as House Chair. Jonathan also serves on the Environment



Committee and the Public Health Committee, which he chaired for six years. In addition, he served seven years on Westport's Representative Town Meeting, three as Deputy Moderator. Jonathan received a BA from Yale University and an MBA from the Stern School of Business at NYU. His business career in healthcare marketing and communications included roles at Revlon, Bristol-Myers, and Mount Sinai Hospital.

In what should be a particularly relevant presentation, Jonathan will speak to us about Connecticut's myriad transportation issues, specifically those affecting Fairfield County. He will be open for questions on this and other subjects of interest to our members.

## **CARPOOL & GO!**

Carpool and Go will return to the Yale Art Gallery on Friday, November 14 for a guided tour through the exhibit **Printing Darkness**, which surveys the fundamental role of darkness in printmaking from the 16th century to the present day. The installation features prints by more than 40 artists, including Rembrandt, Francisco Goya, Jean Dubuffet, and Kiki Smith. Since printmaking relies on contrast between dark and light, we will observe strong differences between woodcuts and the feathery marks of etching.

We'll also have a chance to view the large exhibit Nusantara: Six Centuries of Indonesian (woven) Textiles, which explores the fabrics created between the 14th and 20th centuries in this culturally diverse maritime region. We'll see the rich imagery and technical mastery in the batiks of Java and the Ikat of Sumba, in ritual weavings and architectural hangings. Also on view will be a small exhibit with works by Hans Hoffman, one of the 20th century's most progressive and influential American art teachers. Focusing on his paintings and works on paper, the show illustrates his emphasis on the principles of color, form, and space. We'll have lunch at 11:30 am at Harvest Wine Bar before our guided tour.
